Popcorn is a delicious snack enjoyed by many people around the world. Popcorn can be made and eaten in many ways, such as salted, buttered, sweetened with caramel, or flavored with cheese. Popcorn is a whole grain and can be a very healthy snack if air-popped with no added flavoring. The most modern and quick way to pop popcorn began in the 1940s with the use of a microwave. There are also other interesting and little-known facts about popcorn.

People have been making popcorn for thousands of years. It is believed that making popcorn originated in Mexico. Native American tribes began making it as well and introduced it to European settlers. It was not only eaten but was even worn as jewelry or used for decoration.

What makes popcorn pop? There is a drop of water inside each popcorn kernel. When the water heats up, it turns to steam and begins to fill the kernel. The inside of the kernel gets bigger and the hard outside shell pops open. The kernel is turned inside out, and the popcorn is ready to eat. Most popcorn comes in two basic shapes when it is popped: snowflake, which is bigger, and mushroom, which does not crumble as easily.

With or without flavoring, air popped or not, one thing is true: popcorn is tasty!
