



## Building an Igloo

The second row of snow blocks goes on top of the first row. The blocks are slightly tilted inward so that they lean toward the center. As the igloo builders continue, they place each row of blocks a little farther in. The blocks begin to arch, forming a dome-shaped structure. Skilled builders know how to keep the blocks from falling as they work. Finally, they put one last block of packed snow at the top, and the igloo is complete. They may cut a hole in this last block to let smoke out.

If the people inside an igloo light a candle or use a small oil lamp, the heat from the candle or lamp is trapped inside as well. The heat may start to melt the inside of the igloo walls, but the snow closer to the outside causes the melting snow to freeze again. Refreezing makes the walls icy, and ice is stronger than snow.
